
We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Moses said to the people, "Hear O Israel! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart."



A Very Catholic All Saints Day for Stanford Catholic Grad Students (November 1):


Begin with the Solemnity of All Saints Mass at 12:20 in Memorial Church.

- · Other surprises


