




Collection:




Preface Dialogue


Priest: Deliver us, Lord, we pray...Jesus Christ.

Invitation to Communion


Priest: Behold the Lamb of God... Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.


Communion (8:30AM) "One Bread, One Cup"


