


For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in the glory of God the Father.





Priest: Through him, and with him, and in him...forever and ever. The people sing the Great Amen: [from "Mass of Renewal"]




## The Lord's Prayer
