


Welcome to all who join us. Please participate as much or as little as you feel comfortable. Feel free to stand or kneel with others or to remain seated if you prefer.

you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.


For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in the glory of God the Father.

People: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of


his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.


Preface Dialogue

The people sing the Great Amen: [from "Mass of Renewal"]




The Lord's Prayer

People: For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and forever.





Invitation to Communion
