

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,


[bowing:] who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary,





The Lord's Prayer


Priest: At the Savior's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

Invitation to Communion


Priest: Behold the Lamb of God... Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.
