





The people sing the Great Amen: [from "Mass of Renewal"]




The Lord's Prayer

Invitation to Communion


Priest: Behold the Lamb of God... Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

Communion (4:30) "Baba Yetu"


(Swahili text; sung by choir)
