



- 3) My vows I will make, and may everyone hear me! Draw near me O servants of God. I stand here in the midst of them: Your house, your heart, Jerusalem.





Nicene Creed


Conclusion of Prayer of the Faithful



Invitation to Communion


Priest: Behold the Lamb of God... Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.




