


Priest: The Lord be with you (or similar greeting).

Reader: The Word of the Lord **People:** Thanks be to God.




Gloria (continued—verses)

Priest: Pray, brothers and sisters, that ... be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.


People: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of

his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.


Preface Dialogue
