

We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.





Priest: Pray, brothers and sisters, that ... be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.


**People:** May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of

his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.


### **Preface Dialogue**

#### **Invitation to Communion**


*Priest:* Behold the Lamb of God... Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

**People:** Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof,


but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.
